


### **PHASE ONE**

- Learn principles and techniques of haircutting, finish styling, haircolor, hair care, nail care, and customer service.
- Learn the importance of providing good customer service and having a positive attitude.
- Spend time in a classroom setting learning skills and techniques on mannequins and models.
- After completion of Phase One, you are ready to move to the student salon and begin servicing clients.

## PHASE TWO / THREE

- Academic learning continues one full day per week in the classroom building upon Phase One instruction. You will focus on haircutting and haircoloring skills.
- Adapt techniques on clients and begin building student salon clientele.
- Perform in a salon-modeled environment four days a week.

- After earning 900 hours, you will be eligible to take the State Board written exam.
